

Terms Of Reference: Phlebotomist (External)

Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) in collaboration with NHSRC, is undertaking a study titled "Association of Iodine status with thyroid function among the adult population residing in Delhi: A cross sectional study". This is a community-based study which will be conducted in the field practice areas of 5 medical colleges of New Delhi. To assist the field investigator in carrying out community intervention, perform sample collections and manage logistics on a day-to-day basis, 5 phlebotomists are required for the purpose. The Terms of Reference for the position are mentioned below:

Role: Phlebotomist

Responsibilities:

- Assisting the field investigator in field related activities of the project that include enrollment of the study participants, taking consent, interviewing the study participants, facilitating the required investigations, data collection and data entry.
- Counselling study participants regarding the sample collection and performing the sample collection activities.
- Ensuring the samples collected are transported as per designed protocols and reach the testing facility on the day of collection.
- Ensuring the participants enrolled receive their thyroid profile results by doing home visits/phone calls.
- Performing any other study related activity delegated by Principal investigator or co-investigators.

Qualifications:

Essential: 2-year diploma in medical laboratory technician or one-year DMLT plus one year experience of working in a recognized organization, or Phlebotomy technician course certified through NSDC with one year of field/laboratory experience in a govt recognized organization

Desirable: Experience of working in field/outreach activities involving active interaction with the community.

Maximum age limit: 32 years

Place of postings: New Delhi

Duration: Initially for a period of four months from the date of joining

Remuneration: Rs 26,000 per month /- and TA/DA as per entitlements.
